## LOST IN THE BEWILDERNESS (2014)

A 97-minute documentary about the filmmaker's cousin, Lucas, who was kidnapped and disappeared from Athens, Greece. Eleven years later, he appeared in the United States, sixteen years old. The film follows Orestes, his father, reuniting with Lucas and bringing him back to Greece to live with his refound family. The film ends decades later with the birth of Lucas's son.

#### THREE POMEGRANATE SEEDS (work-in-progress)

A one-hour documentary about the filmmaker's aunt and cousin on their annual religious pilgrimage to the Greek island of Tinos. The film interweaves 40 years of footage with the journey, chronicling the mother-daughter relationship, and Karena's emergence from a mentally and physically handicapped child to an almost self-sufficient woman.
