Community-Engaged Research

VCU Open Minds Faculty (2015-present)

As a core member of VCU's Open Minds faculty (www.openminds.vcu.edu/faculty) I actively engage with inmates (residents) at the Richmond City Justice Center as an instructor of art, visual culture, and art history. These experiences have broadened my research to include concerns related to the school to prison/confinement pipeline and the creation of a service-learning course on that very topic where students engaged with classroom teachers to create units of instruction addresses issues related to mass incarceration in the United States of America. That work has resulted in national and international presentations at conferences as well as peer-reviewed articles in international and national publications and a book chapter from an international press.

Women's Well-Being Initiative Juvenile Arbitration Workshops (Summer 2015 and Summer 2016)

Since 2012 I've been collaborating with the Women's Well-Being Initiative's Juvenile Arbitration workshops in Lexington, SC. I continued that work after moving to Richmond. In the summers of 2015 and 2016 I traveled to South Carolina to co-facilitate arts and media-based workshops with adjudicated youth as a part of their arbitration process. Successful completion of arbitration removes the offense from the youth's record, giving them a "clean slate" with which to carry on with their development.

The findings from these workshops have been published in peer-reviewed articles and been recognized as significant contribution to the field by Visual Arts Research.

Performing Statistics/ART180 (2015-2020)

After inviting Mark Strandquist to visit my class at the jail as a visiting artist in 2015 and participating in his Windows from Prison project (http://www.windowsfromprison.com/) I became more involved with the Performing Statistics project at ART180 in Richmond, VA. Performing Statistics, a project by Art180 and Legal Aid Justice Center, connects incarcerated teens with an incredible group of artists, designers, educators, and Virginia's leading policy advocates to transform the juvenile justice system.

By working with incarcerated youth to become creative and civic leaders in their communities we can support Legal Aid Justice Center's advocacy work to directly affect laws and public policy that affect the school to prison pipeline. My role

has been as curriculum coordinator to tie the works of art and issues explore through the workshops to k12 Standards of Learning for Virginia Public Schools. That curriculum was published by ART180 and is available for download via the Performing Statistics website.

During the spring and summer of 2020 amidst a COVID lockdown, I collaborated with educators in Richmond to provide distance learning arts-based instruction for youth incarcerated in the Richmond Juvenile Detention Center at the behest of Art180 and Performing statistics leadership.

VCU Service Learning Faculty Fellowship (2017-2019)

As a VCU Service Learning Faculty Fellow I'm meeting with other VCU faculty to share in our community engaged scholarship, learning ways to support community engaged scholarship at VCU, and developing ways to strengthen my own community engagement. My project for the academic year 2017-2018 was connected to my service learning designated spring course ARTE 600/800 where we collaborated with program directors from ART180 to develop "field guides" for the ART180 Big Show. The Big Show is an exhibition of youth-created artwork from the many ART180 programs that serve the Richmond, VA area. Our service project was to create user-experiences to help the community understand the scope and breadth of what ART180 provides to the community while also creating a space for dialog around the works of art. Our contact at ART180 was former Program Director Kate Duffy. This community-engaged work included an international collaboration with students and faculty in Helsinki, Finland at Aalto University. After the culmination of the spring semester, the five graduate students from the ARTE 600/800 course traveled with me to Helsinki for a one week intensive graduate course investigating the "service" of art education from a global perspective. Students then presented their findings at the regional congress of the International Society for Education through Art in Helsinki in the summer of 2018. For the continuation of my faculty fellowship during the 2018-2019 academic year, I partnered with VCU Department of Focused Inquiry to collaboratively develop guided tours of the Institute for Contemporary Art's exhibitions to align with themes from VCU common books (taught in Focused Inquiry classes). Graduate students led inquiry-based tours for undergraduates through the ICA's exhibition during the fall of 2018 and again in the spring of 2019. Valeria Luisella, author of Tell Me How it Ends, toured the exhibition with my students during her campus visit in the fall of 2018.
