At Houghton Mifflin, I worked under the direction of Walter Lorraine with such award-winning authors as Chris Van Allsburg, David Macaulay, Jim Marshall, Lois Lowry, Alan Say, and Bill Peet, among many others. I designed Caldecott winners, including *The Polar Express*, *Black and White*, *Bill Peet*, *An Autobiography*, and *The Boy of the Three-year Nap*.

In 1989 I spearheaded the computerization of the art department of the children's book at Little, Brown and Company. I worked with the educational start-up Turnstone during the internet boom years of the 1990s.

Starting in 2001, I helped Charlesbridge Publishing in Watertown grow the children's book department into a mid-size, award-winning company. While at Charlesbridge, we published books from Judy Sue Goodwin Sturges' Picture and Word class and numerous RISD grads who wrote and /or illustrated books for us, including Stuart Murphy, Rachel Himes, Pau Estrada, and Sam Streed.

Over the years I have worked with many emerging artists, such as Margot Apple, Duncan Tonatuih, Vanessa Brantley-Newton, and Daniel Miyares.

Educational engagement

I've been on the critique schedule for Judy Sue Goodwin Sturges' Picture and Word class since the 1980s, and have been leading a 2-day "Type Design for Illustrators" workshop for her classes for the past six years, working closely with the students on their final projects.

Throughout my career, I have lectured regularly at Society of Children's Book Writers and Illustrators conferences around the world. I have given workshops for illustrators at RISD, the University of Southern Maine, and Maine College of Art.

My archeological work has consisted of participation in excavations at Copan, Honduras and in Veracruz, Mexico, about which I have given papers at the Society of American Archeologists. In 1996 I worked on exhibits at the Copan Sculpture Museum. My thesis, titled *The Broken Cup*, analyzed ceramics of the classic period in Veracruz.
